As I talk to Grand Knights, District Deputies, or even council members from around the Diocese, I am hearing that most councils are conducting distanced live meetings with mask wearing and vaccinations encouraged. As we get farther into January and February, don't be surprised if "Zoom" meetings are recommended again until this new Omicron Variant subsides.

I am pleased when I hear about many councils doing prayer services, rosaries and Chaplets. Food drives and food pantry contributions are numerous. Drive-thru events such as Drive by Santa and carry-out only dinners were still happening around the diocese. It is good that we have not just pulled the plug completely and are doing nothing. Be creative and keep plugging away at being as helpful as you possibly can. Councils that are not meeting during this recent COVID spike should be at least trying to hold virtual officer meetings. I know that recruiting new members has been very difficult when you don't have contact with potential members. Just remember, E-Membership works.

We have our Mid-Year District Deputy meeting in Columbus this weekend. Our Youngstown Team and most of our District Deputies will be there. We will get opportunities to discuss some of the problems and successes that our councils are having with meetings, activities, and recruiting new members. I don't know that we will come up with any concrete solutions, but I know that there will be options to consider and bring back to our councils.

Our membership numbers throughout the Youngstown Diocese have not been going well. We have just passed the 60 new member mark this year, and less than half of the councils in the Diocese bringing in new members. Usually, we have over 100 by this time so we need to double our new member count. Hopefully, the non-recruiting councils have some new members lined up to bring in soon. Do all that you can to promote the order through e Membership and online degrees held every Wednesday. If your council needs help with conducting a live degree, contact our Diocesan Membership Directors, Chris Dodson or Pete Rich.

Now is a good time follow-up with a personal one-on-one discussion with anyone who showed some interest in joining the Knights when you had your last parish/church membership drive. We need to start getting firm commitments from these potential members and make them a permanent member. It is also time to start planning your next membership drive. Councils who have not yet brought in a new member this year need to get going and bring in at least one or two new members. My challenge was for every council to bring in at least one new member.

Keep on keeping on, stay the course, and, stay safe.

Report of the State Special Reports Chairman

Worthy Knights of the Youngstown Diocese,

The January 1 Star Council Report for Ohio was recently distributed. Youngstown Diocese had 53 new members recruited for this fraternal year from 20 councils

There are still 16 Youngstown councils missing their Form 365 to Supreme. Remember, this form has the email addresses for your Program Director, Family Director and Community Director, which Supreme will forward the website for Safe

Environment training. There are 19 councils who have 4 officers in Safe Environment training or have been approved as compliant.

And there are still 5 councils in our diocese missing the Form 185. Please get your 365's and 185's submitted soon. District Deputies: please contact your grand knights and assist them in submitting these forms.

42 councils in the Youngstown Diocese contributed \$8,378 for the 2021 Matching Funds Campaign. Many of these councils had their donations "Matched" by the Ohio Charity Foundation. Great job!

13 councils in our diocese have submitted a program report for the state program contest so far this fraternal year. Remember you must use the Supreme Report Form 10784 for submitting activities that will be used by the state council. Ask your district deputy for more information.

Participating in two webinars or seminars are required for achieving your Insurance Quota for the Star Council Award. Supreme Council reports that one council in our diocese has been given credit for participating in a Fraternal Benefit Night activity.



We had another outstanding "Matching Funds" effort by most of the councils in the Youngstown Diocese this year! Once again, we had over 40 councils from the Youngstown Diocese participating along with 5 Assemblies and 1 Chapter. The final numbers won't be available until after the checks are presented to the diocesan Religious Education Directors this weekend at the Mid-Year District Deputy meeting in Columbus. We will beat last year's total dollars contributed and will end up with the highest "Match" amount in the state since most of our Youngstown councils submitted their contribution early in the year. The end result is that we presented a significant check with the largest

Measure Up 2021 results

Thank you to all of our Youngstown Diocese councils who participated in this year's 2021 Measure Up Campaign. We had 29 Councils participate, raising \$30,655 for Measure Up and those with Developmental Disabilities. We sent checks to 36 different organizations around this area. This amount is again lower than the amount we usually raise, but considering the COVID issues this past year, it is quite good. Although the councils from the Youngstown Diocese did not raise the largest total dollar amount in the state, like our Matching Funds campaign, we had the highest council participation rate in the state. We should all be quite proud of that participation figure.

Congratulations to Father Venglarik Council 11915 from Boardman for having the highest "Gimme Five" total of all Division 2 councils in the state with \$1,200.00 and also

In order to hit a Million \$ in ticket sales, we will have to sell 200,000 tickets across the State of Ohio. Partnering is a great way for your council to increase the number of tickets that you sell and to increase your number of tickets sold per member. This in turn gives your council more money back in rebates at the end of the year. Now is the time to finalize partnering plans with any groups/organizations that are helping your council sell tickets. Councils should definitely plan on mailing tickets to all members. Many councils had a very successful SCB ticket campaign in spite of the pandemic because they mailed tickets out to all of their members. Mail tickets to your members and ask them to buy and sell the tickets that they receive from you. If you think your council will need more tickets than last year because of mailing tickets, partnering, or new ticket strategies, let me know so that I can have them ready for you at the ticket distribution in February.



State Charities Tickets Distribution Meetings will be held across the state of Ohio the first two weekends in February. Our meeting at the Youngstown Diocese will be on Saturday, February 5th at 10:00 AM at the Randolph St. Joseph Council Hall which has a Mogadore address. St. Joseph Council 2039 will be hosting the meeting. (We have held several State Tour meetings there - it's next to the St. Joseph Catholic Church.) The address is 2697 Waterloo Rd. Mogadore, OH. 44260 Your council needs to have 2 members present to receive the council attendance rebate.







Saint Joseph - Our Spiritual Father Traveling Icon 2021-2023

Every few years, the Knights of Columbus selects an icon of a saint whose patronage is particularly inspiring to Knights and their communities. Ohio has received 4 of these icons which will travel from council to council and serve as the centerpieces for prayer services in parishes throughout the Order. Since the first traveling pilgrim icon of Our Lady of Guadalupe in 1979, more than 174,800 council and parish prayer services with some 22 million participants have been held.

The Pilgrim Icon Program is an effort to spread devotion to St. Joseph and pray for the courage to stand up and carry out our mission of protecting, defending, and raising future generations. The prayer ser-
