- *WHEREAS* Blessed Michael McGivney was a dedicated priest, serving as the pastor of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut; and
- WHEREAS Blessed Michael McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus with the help of several men of St. Mary's Parish in New Haven in 1882 to strengthen their faith and to provide financial assistance in the event of their death to the widows and orphans they left behind; and
- WHEREAS The cause for Blessed Michael McGivney's sainthood was opened by Hartford Archbishop Daniel A. Cronin in December 1997 and was presented to the Vatican in 2000, and is now under review by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints; and
- WHEREAS On Saturday, March 15, 2008, Pope Benedict XVI approved a decree recognizing the heroic virtue of Blessed Michael McGivney, founder of the Knights of Columbus, and with this declaration significantly advanced Blessed Michael McGivney's process toward sainthood; and
- WHEREAS Blessed Michael McGivney joined the rolls of the Blessed on October 31, 2021, in the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford, Connecticut at which time, an Apostolic Letter from Pope Francis was read which recognized Blessed Michael McGivney's humility, charity and concern for the welfare of all people; and
- WHEREAS We, the members of the Knights of Columbus, are profoundly grateful for this recognition of the holiness of our founder and the strength of the Knights of Columbus today is a testament to his timeless vision, his holiness, and his ideals.

### THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,

That the Ohio State Officers, delegates, and guests attending this 124<sup>th</sup> Annual Ohio State Convention in Columbus, Ohio this May 20, 2023, will vigorously continue to support the cause for sainthood of Blessed Michael McGivney, and that we continue to offer prayers of support for this noble and caring priest.

- WHEREAS The Ohio Knights of Columbus honor and commend Pope Francis for leading a humble, Christ-like life of prayer, study of God's Word, and compassion for the poor that resulted in his election as the Supreme Pontiff, the Bishop of Rome, the 265th successor of Peter; and
- WHEREAS Pope Francis is now the spiritual leader of 1.2 billion Catholics world-wide as well as the many non-Catholic believers who prayed for the election of a Pope who would have a servant's heart and set a humble, Christ-like example for all Christians; and

- WHEREAS Lawrence Henry McCauley was a life member of the Knights of Columbus, Lancaster – Council 1016 from age 18, and supported many charitable endeavors over the course of his 100 years on this earth, including raising funds for the construction of Columbus St. Agatha Church, the St. Therese's Retreat Center in Columbus Diocese and at the age of 97 raising thousands of dollars for the Mid-Ohio Food Bank by walking laps around his cul-de-sac during the pandemic; and
- *WHEREAS* the Knights of Columbus hold Charity as a core principle of the Knights of Columbus; and
- WHEREAS Lawrence Henry McCauley served his community as Past Commander, American Legion Post 82, Past Department of Ohio Treasurer and Buckeye Boys State banking chairman, American Legion, life member VFW Post 2374, and Catholic War Veterans Post #1936, past president of the St. Agatha Men's Club, past president of the Catholic Men's Luncheon Club at Columbus St. Patrick's, and Catholic Laymen's Retreat League, as well as serving as a Eucharistic Minister at Riverside Methodist Hospital, and as a founder and first treasurer of the Watterson Athletic Association; and
- WHEREAS the Knights of Columbus hold Charity and Unity as core principles; and
