## **REPORT OF THE STATE DEPUTY**

#### **Our Theme**

#### Measure Up Campaign

I would like to personally thank all the Brother Knights and their families who have made the 2023 Measure Up Campaign another success!

There were 150 Councils that participated in the campaign that raised over \$270,470.00. Their contributions will benefit over 322 agencies, programs and schools throughout Ohio that provide

services to citizens with developmental disabilities. We as Knights of Columbus and charitable men have demonstrated our continued support of our "flagship" charity.

On behalf of all the citizens in Ohio with developmental disabilities, thank you for your generosity and dedication to this program.

I would like to recognize State Measure Up Chairman State Warden Christopher Sarka for another successful Measure Up Campaign.

#### **Matching Funds Campaign**

I would like to personally thank all the Brother Knights and their families who have made the 2022 Matching Funds Campaign another success here in Ohio.

A total of 200, Councils and 18 Assemblies and 1 Chapter participated that raised \$56,678.00. A \$31,500.00 Matching Fund Grant was awarded by the Ohio Charity Foundation bringing the campaign total to \$75,993.00. An additional grant of \$750.00 was also awarded to the Byzantine Eparchy of Parma and \$250.00 to the Eparchy of Newton for their use in religious education. These contributions will support the many agencies, programs and schools throughout the six Catholic Diocese of Ohio providing religious educational services to the local parishes and schools. We as a brotherhood have demonstrated our continuing support of religious education. The real success of this annual campaign will be measured by the educational materials that the Catholic people of each diocese will continue to receive in the years to come.

On behalf of all the Directors of Religious Education throughout Ohio, I thank you for your generosity and dedication to this program.

I would like to recognize State Matching Funds Chairman for 2022, State Advocate James Maslach for another successful Matching Funds.

#### Super Cash Bonanza

As I write this summary of the fraternal year the 2023 Super Cash Bonanza Campaign is well underway. State Treasurer Michael Felerski and his "Road Show" Team did a great job of presenting the campaign to the membership. The idea and rewards of a good partnering program along with council ticket sales was stressed. A record number of 676,200 tickets were distributed at nine "Road Show" stops throughout Ohio.

#### Football Frenzy Sweepstakes Program

The Football Frenzy Sweepstakes program has continued to provide local councils an opportunity to earn money for their general operating funds. The 2023 Football Sweepstakes tickets sales were around 25,300, down about 3%, but councils were able to reap over \$210,000.00 in rebates and per capita credit for their councils. Many of the councils took advantage of a special incentive rebate offered in this year's program to reduce their state per capita liability.

Final Four Sweepstakes tickets sold over 4.300 tickets, down from the previous year, however, this program earned nearly an additional \$15,000.00 for general operating expenses. Look for the

State Council to continue the State Per Capita Rebate based proposals in the next State Council Administration. I still believe that this may be Ohio's sleeping giant of a fundraiser.

I would like to recognize State Fund Raising Chairman PSD Gary Eckstein for running another successful Football Frenzy Campaign. Few of us know what goes on behind the scenes and what it takes to chair a program of this importance. I cannot thank him enough for what he does for everyone at the State Council.

#### March Madness Basketball Sweepstakes

The March Madness Basketball Sweepstakes was a general mail program that had a limited ticket distribution to a database of prior ticket purchasers. A low-key sweepstakes campaign was run so as not to interfere with the Super Cash Bonanza Program. A reinvestment of a portion of the proceeds of the Football Frenzy Sweepstakes Program was used to fund the program.

With limited sales of 4,312 tickets sold the State Council earned \$14,800.00 for general operating expenses. This was nearly a 29% decrease in sales over the previous year. Thank you to everyone who participated in this extra fundraising effort.

I would like to again recognize State Fund Raising Chairman PSD Gary Eckstein for taking it upon himself to run this campaign.

#### **State Council Website**

With thanks to a lot of patience and planning, we have a website that is highly informative. It is just not a website anymore. The site has the ability to instruct and inform our members. It has the ability to give the members the opportunity to grow as a member, as a council, and as a jurisdiction.

I would personally like to thank State Webmaster Thomas Buehner for all the time and efforts he has put forth to make the State Website as functional as possible. We also look to him for greater things to come within the electronic realms of the State Council Website.

#### **Ohio License Plates**

When renewing your plates, you must ask the Deputy Registrar for Knights of Columbus plates. Many members continue to request Knights of Columbus license plates here in Ohio. I trust that someday all members will have a vehicle with a Knights of Columbus license plate. Remember \$10.00 of the extra \$20.00 license fee is refunded to the State Council and is used as a part of our donation to the Ohio Special Olympics.

#### **Our Patriotic Degree**

We thank the Brother Knights that serve this great State of Ohio with distinction as Masters of the Fourth Degree under Vice Supreme Master Edward Ponder of the Hennepin Province. The District Masters for Ohio are Christopher Bush, Michael Gauder, and Brandon Robinson.

#### The Ultrasound Initiative

#### Saint Joseph Icon Program

The Saint Joseph Icon program began last October. The four icons of the Saint Joseph icon will circulate through the State of Ohio over the previous two years. The Icon was scheduled in each district for an entire month. This schedule would give every council and district some time to set up the prayer service either in a council chamber or in a parish. Many councils took full advantage of this prayerful opportunity to honor the Saint Joseph Icon within your council and parish.

We thank State Warden Brother Christopher Sarka for accepting the Chairmanship of this prayerful cause.

#### Finances

The finances of the State Council continue to be a challenge. Our job as State Officers should be to find ways to enhance our programs rather than eliminate or cut funding to them. We have taken measures to reduce costs in many areas but still at time find it hard to make ends meet.

With an ageing membership we again are presented with a significant loss in per capita revenue. We also have had a significant loss in membership over years past; this also has contributed to the loss in per capita revenue.

The Ohio membership is by far the least taxed of G-11 Jurisdictions, yet they are one of the most compensated. Very few states pay their delegates as well as we do to attend the annual convention.

#### **District Deputies**

The work of a District Deputy cannot go unnoticed. The job of a District Deputy is not that of a titleholder anymore. They have become an integral part of the State Council. They have been given a great responsibility to present, to promote, and to monitor all the programs the State Council sets before them. We know all too well that this is not an easy task. We also realize that you sacrifice many evenings away from the family in the workings of your office.

I, as State Deputy, and in unison with the State Officers, would sincerely like to thank you for all the hours of service you have provided to the State Council. May God continue to give you strength to continue your work and bless each one of you in your efforts.

## **REPORT OF THE STATE SECRETARY**

I bid you fraternal greetings to all in attendance at the 124<sup>th</sup> annual convention of the Ohio State Council Knights of Columbus.

As my last year as State Secretary comes to a close, I continue to be amazed at how quickly my years as a State Officer have passed and often wonder where the time went. I want to take a moment here to thank all the Brother Knights throughout Ohio for allowing me to serve as a State Officer. It has been an extremely gratifying and eye-opening experience. I continue to learn something new about the State Council each and every day and I know it will continue to be a tremendous challenge for me in the days ahead. Any success will be only made possible by the efforts of many and the grace of our Blessed Mother and our Lord Jesus Christ.

The office of Secretary has been a tremendous learning experience. As the State Secretary, you are responsible for the record keeping of the day-to-day financial workings of the Ohio State Council. It continues to be a constant process in growth as an officer, always preparing oneself for the next level of involvement. I am most fortunate to have the opportunity to work with such a talented group of dedicated men serving as State Officers alongside myself. They have gone the extra mile to ensure that I am comfortable in my position and with my duties as the State Secretary. I respectfully thank them for their assistance and co-operation.

As the State Secretary I have maintained the four State Council bank accounts. This includes issuing and writing checks as directed by the State Deputy and the reconciliation of each of those four accounts every month. During this past fiscal year, there were over 1400 checks written and payments made against those accounts for; State Convention Mileage and Per Diem, Measure Up Grants, Super Cash Bonanza Rebates, Football Frenzy Prizes and Rebates, Basketball Final Four winners and general operating expenses of the Ohio State Council. At the end of the State Council fiscal year a record of all deposits, checks, and reconciliations are submitted to the accounting firm of Blue & Company for audit, verification, and agreement with other state council financial records. These records and audit were made available to the Convention Audit Committee for their online inquiry and review via the Zoom internet meeting platform.

As State Secretary I continue to oversee the state council's accounting operation on a web-based operation through Quick Books. This operating system allows each of the fiscal officers to also monitor and to take a greater role in the state council's day to day finances. Having a web-based operation allows the State Deputy to have complete access to all the four state council accounts, and, at any time, knows where the state council stands financially. This process has given the State Treasurer the ability to record all state council deposits and have a hands-on responsibility of the financial and accounting system two years earlier than as in past administrations. This system has also allowed me as State Secretary, more efficient record keeping and the ability to keep the officers of the state council informed to state council finances. The web-based operation also provides the state council's accounting firm of Blue & Company to oversee the financial workings of the state council at any time, eliminating any chance of major error to our financial record keeping.

Another responsibility of the State Secretary is to assess, levy, and collect Per Capita billings each year after the State Convention in May. Per Capita invoices, which are based on a council's

total membership, are printed, and sent to the councils in the State of Ohio. Ohio's Per capita tax of \$6.50 per member is one of the lowest among the large jurisdictions within the entire order. The Per Capita billing is the primary source of revenue for the Ohio State Council. With the Per capita monies, the State Officers promote their programs as well as pay mileage and per diem to the state convention delegates. These monies are also used to pay mileage, per diem, and other state business related expenses to the State Officers as well as other State and Diocesan Personnel when approved by the State Deputy.

As State Secretary I am the chairman of both the Audit and Credentials Committees. The Audit Committee members are given the opportunity to review the state council's financial records for the past fiscal year, which runs from April 1 to March 31. This also includes the review of the State Council's financial audit for the past fiscal year. The Credential Committee will ensure that the convention is correctly represented with an accurate count of delegates and hierarchy within the state council.

As the State Officer of the Diocese of Youngstown, I truly believe that "Team Youngstown" is 100% committed to advancing and growing the order in the Youngstown Diocese. They continue to rise to the occasion and have made this year another year to remember. The councils have taken to the task coming out of our recent "pandemic" years and are working on getting their membership and programming levels back to pre-Pandemic standards. Needless to say, I am proud to represent them as a State Officer.

The three General Insurance Agencies that cover our diocese with the addition of several new Field Agents continues to respond to the insurance needs of our members and their families, to provide a great product of insurance benefits, and to assist in the exploration of potential new growth within our diocese.

In closing, it has been an honor to serve our State Deputy Mark Siracusa and the team of Brother Knights of the "*Lord, I am Your Servant*" State Program. I thank you fellow officers for the continued direction, fraternity, and patience during my second year as State Secretary. I must continue to thank those who assisted me and put up with me most, my closest associates and their wives, Brothers Mike Jordan, Chris Dodson, Mark Kahanca, Joe Mackos, Ken Girt, Phil Salasek, and Pete Rich. I especially must also thank my loving wife, Judy. For without her approval, support, and understanding, none of this would have been possible. I thank God each and every day for the talent and ability he has given me and for the energies necessary to complete my tasks and serve our Order in this capacity. I just hope and pray that I may live up to all expectations in my next step along the way.

## **REPORT OF THE STATE TREASURER**

Greetings brother Knights and ladies to the 124th Annual Convention of the Ohio State Council Knights of Columbus here in Columbus. What incredible progress we have made in the last twelve months!

The primary responsibility of the State Treasurer is to record the deposits for the four major State Council accounts: General, Fundraising, and Measure Up as well as the State Convention account. This past fiscal year there were 341 deposits made and over 6800 checks deposited with Chase Bank into the State Council's accounts. At the end of the State Council fiscal year, the records of all deposits are submitted to the accounting firm of Blue & Co., LLC for the financial audit, verification, and agreement with other state council financial records. These records and audit are made available to the Convention Audit Committee for their inquiry and review.

As a member of the Ohio Charity Foundation the State Treasurer is required to attend the Foundation's semi-annual meetings and may also serve on the Foundation's Scholarship Committee. In addition to this, the Treasurer is also a member of the Foundation's Budget and Investment Committee and serves as the Recording Secretary for that committee. I have also taken on the responsibility of the Ohio Knights of Columbus specialty license plate program. These special plates which cost an additional twenty dollars per year brought in \$2,540 this past fiscal year which goes directly into our Measure-Up program account. The plates are also a great way to increase our recognizability within our communities and as of a month ago the plates have been updated with our Order's current logo.

Brothers, as I write this report, we are twenty days away from the 2023 Super Cash Bonanza drawing to be held on Saturday, May 20th at the State Convention. "I Need You!" is this year's charity raffle theme playing off last year's success of the Charity Brothers. This is the largest fundraiser of the year for the Knights of Ohio. Our goal once again is to reach \$1,000,000 in sales and we are currently on pace to achieve that with your help. I hope you took advantage of mailing and "partnering" which was discussed during the Super Cash "Road Show". I would like to thank Past State Deputy Larry Moegling, Past State Deputy Gary Eckstein, and of course State Deputy Mark Siracusa for their informative and entertaining presentations during our road show stops.

I would also like to thank "Mackinac" Matt Stapleton, Rob "Curtis" Malone, "Southside" Jim Maslach, "Sister" Alicia Gresko, Sister Katie Stapleton, and "The Patient Parishioner" Kathy Maslach for helping create the *Charity Brothers Return* movie short for this year's Super Cash Bonanza Charity Raffle theme. I hope you enjoyed watching it as much as we enjoyed making it. When Matt and I came up with the idea for the cameos we never thought it would be so successful. You can find a link to it on our state website. There was no way I could have done it without them. Finally, I want to thank our past state deputies (especially Gary Eckstein the leader in fundraising and my mentor in this endeavor), the priests, and the Bishops of Ohio for their support.

Again, I cannot say enough about all the support I received from everyone throughout the state this year especially my "Barrel Captain" Benjamin Tobe, John "Johnny" Scales, my District

Deputy Coordination Timothy Mangan, our State Program Chairman Andrew Nuckols, State Membership Director Michael Freil, and of course PSD Dave Helmstetter. But sadly this fraternal year our state lost another great Knight in Past State Deputy John Welch. PSD Welch's "Called to Serve" theme and program symbolized what the Knights in Ohio are truly all about, and no doubt we will continue to carry that on.

## **REPORT OF THE STATE ADVOCATE**

Fraternal greetings to all in attendance during this 124<sup>th</sup> State Convention of the Ohio State Council Knights of Columbus. It is great to be able to be back together and to celebrate all that we accomplished last year.

One of my primary responsibilities as State Advocate in the Jurisdiction of Ohio is Chairman of the Matching Funds Campaign held in the fall of each fraternal year. The monies collected for Matching Funds are given to the religious education and evangelization departments in each diocese in Ohio. All the money collected stays within the council's, chapter's, or assembly's diocese. This fraternal year created a challenge since many of our councils often collect their donations in their churches, and with so many of them operating at a reduced capacity, we did not know how well the program would fare this year.

With our 2022 theme; "Growing the Faith Through Catholic Education" our councils, assemblies and chapters were able raise \$44,089 which was an increase of \$8,917 than the previous fraternal year. This shows that the Knights of Columbus, in Ohio, continued our commitment to Catholic Education and Evangelization. When you include the generous \$25,000 matching contribution by the Ohio Charity Foundation and a \$6,500 match from the Ohio State Council State Officers, we reached a grand total of \$75,589. Thank you everyone throughout the state for your diligent efforts in supporting this fraternal year's campaign.

A total of eight (8) checks were presented at the January 2023 Mid-Year Meeting:

- Archdiocese of Cincinnati: \$15,950.86
- Diocese of Cleveland: \$10,190.23
- Diocese of Columbus: \$13,148.89
- Diocese of Steubenville: \$2,793.19
- Diocese of Toledo: \$15,996.45
- Diocese of Youngstown: \$16,175.48
- Eparchy of Parma: \$750 and
- Eparchy of Newton: \$250 on behalf of the Ohio Charity Foundation.

The state continued to offer our Online Exemplification of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity every Wednesday night at 7PM via Zoom this fraternal year. ## **REPORT OF THE IMMEDIATE PAST STATE DEPUTY**

To all the Delegates, Attendees, and Guests of the 124<sup>th</sup> Ohio State Council Convention here in Columbus,

As Immediate Past State Deputy, I have served in an advisory role to our State Deputy Mark Siracusa and the state officer team. It has been an honor to serve with this team of officers. Congratulations to Mark, his officer corps, and his membership and programming team for a successful 2022-2023 fraternal year.

My prime responsibility this fraternal year has been tracking the financial contributions of the annual Support Our Seminarians (S.O.S.) program. I am pleased to report that this has been a very good fraternal year for vocations overall. Currently, over two hundred local councils, eight assemblies, and three chapters have contributed \$160,265.14 in support of the vocation's programs throughout the six dioceses of Ohio.

The financial summary (before expenses) for each diocese includes the following:

Over the last several years, Columbus has exceeded \$50,000 in each campaign, which is the most in Support Our Seminarians history. What a tremendous improvement over the 2002 campaign when the Columbus diocese raised just a little over \$6,000. Congratulations are extended to the Diocese of Columbus brother knights for their contributions.

This year's campaign marks the ninth straight year in which the overall state total has exceeded \$100,000 and is the fifth highest campaign total in program history. This campaign raises our collections for vocations to just over \$1.8 million since 2002.

I would also like to recognize four councils that donated over \$5,000 each and received the Gold Award: St. Brendan Council #11208 at \$9,788.50, St. Andrew Council #11275 at \$6,573.48, Christ the King Council #13705 at \$5,182.38 and Bishop McFadden Council #3777 at \$5,036.00.

This year 47 councils and 1 chapter reached the \$1,000 plateau or better to earn recognition at this state convention. Again, special thanks to all. *Please refer to the following chart*.

Greetings Brother Knights & families. Welcome to the 124th Ohio State Convention. 2023 Looks like it is going to be a Good Year for Membership Growth, and we are on target to meet our Membership Goals this year.

It has never been easier and quicker to join the Knights of Columbus than it is now.

E-Membership has made it more convenient for Men to join us in a quicker fashion vs the filling out the form 100 and sending it in. With the E-membership, it has enabled Ohio to grow its membership very well this year. As of this writing, we are standing at nearly 80% of our goal met, with two and a half months to go. I am confident with a last quarter push; we can make our Goal. We have been slow but steady with our New Members coming in each month.

Our new Council Growth this year has been in New Hispanic Councils. As of this writing we have formed 2 New Hispanic Councils, 18147 San Francisco Javier Willard, Ohio, and 18195 San Pedro, Columbus, Ohio. On the verge of forming is a Hispanic Council in New Carlisle, Ohio, Sacred Heart Parish. There is another possibility that's on the radar for Hamilton, Ohio and that will be pursued after the convention. When we started the Fraternal Year in July, we had 400+ Councils that had not signed up a new member. As of this writing we are down to about 130 Councils that have not signed up a new member. Hopefully by June 15<sup>th</sup> we can whittle that number down in half.

We must continue to ASK men in our Parishes to join our Order, as the more men that join us, the stronger our Church will be. If we do not ask men to join with us, they won't.

I want to thank the 13 Members of the State Membership Team that have helped me get the word out into their Dioceses and into their Councils, which has helped us with our Membership Growth this year. Each Team Member was an integral part of our Growth this year. Membership is vital to each and every Council. It not only helps the Council grow, but it also helps to replace those who have passed away, and also enables us to do the good work we do.

Wow! The finishing touches of my second year as State Community Director for the State of Ohio are winding down. The fraternal year has seen councils recovering from a few dormant years and getting back into the normal phase in reporting their community activities. I am amazed and proud of the various community activities councils in the State of Ohio have reported throughout the year. Brother Knights are continuing to be a primary resource for church and community needs. The number of entries continues to be small, but the essays were beautifully written. The Free Throw Championship program was conducted at the Council, District, Regional and State level. The fraternal year shows 162 councils submitting at least one Community Program Activity. A total of 845 Community Activities were reported. 59 councils maxed the Community Program which is higher than the past year.

There is much disinformation prevalent today, so Education is needed, and we should help provide Education.

Thank you to the 139 of 372 councils that supported the many Life Programs. The following are some upcoming Life programs that many Ohio councils are currently doing or have done: A Life Program goal for the fraternal year was for each council to support a Pregnancy Resource Center. The Women who are facing crisis pregnancies need our help and supporting/being connected to a resource center in your area would be a difference maker. The new Supreme Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP) program provides an opportunity to support and then received \$100 for each \$500 contributes. Not every Pregnancy Resource Center is being supported, but a LOT are, THANK YOU for doing this!!

Silver Rose Program - Ohio will host the Silver Rose from June 25 to July 22. Several councils will be hosting the Silver Rose during that time.

Ultrasound initiative – in the last few months we have awarded or paid for five units, with a few more in the works and should be ready soon. Please remember that statistics show that 90% of women in a crisis pregnancy, who see their ultrasound, will keep their baby.

I was glad to see so many councils offering up your Rosary monthly or quarterly for Life. Many prayed a Novena for Life in your council & your parish in January. A few councils invited their local Special Olympics representative to speak at a social night and supported them with monetary donations and donations of time.

As a council, many attended right to life events/dinners and supported the organizations who are the front line and lobbying legislators for Life. There was an EXCELLENT turnout for the first annual Ohio March for Life in October and look forward to many more Council at the 2023 event.

I have seen several councils report they hosted a movie night for the council/parish with movies such as "Unplanned", "Bella", "Roe v. Wade", "The Matter of Life", "Lifemark" or "October Baby". You had pizza, popcorn, cookies, and lemonade with a free will offering, with proceeds to Life organizations.

I also created a backup rebate calculation program as a verification for the rebate calculations of our primary raffleticket recorder.

# **REPORT OF THE STATE WEBSITE DIRECTOR**

This year, we were again able to work with Supreme to allow councils to submit their General Program activities directly to Supreme via the Fraternal Programs Report Form #10784.

At the end of each month of the fraternal year, Supreme provided us with a data dump of everything submitted to them from the councils across the state of Ohio. In turn, we were able to import this data into our state website, allowing the State Program Directors to grade the activities to count toward the State General Program. This eliminated the need for councils to duplicate submitting the same information twice (once to Supreme and again to the State).

As of April 16, 2023, Supreme received 2,685 activities submitted to them from 176 councils in the state of Ohio.

## **REPORT OF THE FUNDRAISING CHAIRMAN**

Worthy State Deputy Mark Siracusa, State Officers, State Directors, District Deputy's, Grand Knights, and Brother Knights of the 123<sup>rd</sup> Annual State Convention of the Ohio State Council Knights of Columbus.

The 2022 Football Sweepstakes program continued to grow thus helping all councils that participated to earn additional cash rebates along with a credit toward this annual state per capita tax. The State Council created new incentives that encourage councils to increase their football ticket sakes so they may increase their rebates to over \$10.00 for each ticket sold. As a result, this year's council sales increased cash rebates and per capita credit to over \$205,000.00.

The 2022 FBS sales were down almost 800 tickets over the 2021 sales; but many councils took advantage of the incentive offers by State Deputy Mark Siracusa. As a result, we had over 25,200 football sweepstake tickets sold. This is another outstanding job by our membership that directly benefits their local councils.

The 2023 Football Sweepstakes will begin in July, with tickets being distributed on the diocesan tours. **Our goal -- selling all 35,960 tickets.** Last year we sold nearly 71% of our goal and awarded over \$192,000.00 in cash rebates – so should we reach our goal of 35,960 – *councils would be sharing in nearly \$500,000 in rebates.* So, get on the 2023 Football Sweepstakes team and make extra money for your council while enjoying the NFL football season by winning some of the over **\$27,500.00** in prizes.
