Thank you to everyone who is working to make this happen. Grand Knights and Membership Directors please keep council growth and membership the foremost priority in every one of your councils throughout this great state of Ohio. We are beginning to show an increase in the number of councils recruiting and bringing in new members. To date about 50% of the councils around the state are carrying the load in new membership. If the State of Ohio is to improve our membership status and grow as a jurisdiction, we need the other 50% to step up and begin recruiting. A new member from each of those councils would make a significant impact on our bottom line today. We are all on the same team and all in the game together. I need a firm commitment from all involved to make this happen.

We are again looking for some opportunities again in February. There are still a lot of prospective members just waiting to be asked or need to be contacted. State Growth Director, Andrew Nuckols, has some incentives in February and March for Councils and Brother Knights that bring in new members. See Andrew's article later in this news-letter that lists all the state and supreme growth incentives going on right now. Growth in new membership brings in new Brother Knights, new ideas, and new energy into your councils. Please get on track with your council's membership program and sign up a new member today. If you haven't brought in a new member this year please take a moment and ask yourself why.

In addition to the 1860 new members Ohio needs to bring in to achieve Circle of Honor, we need 59 councils to achieve the Star Council award. Besides meeting the membership quota to achieve Star Council, councils must submit their 16 Faith In Action activities, be Youth Protection compliant, and meet the Fraternal Benefits Nights requirements. To date, only 28 councils have hosted a Fraternal Benefit Night. Please don't wait until the last minute to host a Fraternal Benefit Night. Especially if you have a good chance of meeting your council's growth quota. Contact your K of C Field Agent or General Agent to make arrangements. In addition to possibly getting some more of your members protected by our financial products, this is a good way to bring some new members into your councils. Invite the parish to your Fraternal Benefit event so that they can find out all that the Knights have to offer.

I would like to recognize State Fundraising Chairman PSD Gary Eckstein for running another successful Football Frenzy Campaign. Few of us know what goes on behind the scenes and what it takes to chair a program of this importance. I cannot thank him enough for what he does for everyone at the State Council. This Football Frenzy campaign is the number one reason why our state per capita is among the lowest of all states and jurisdictions in the Order. Look for some interesting proposals from State Fundraising Chairman Gary Eckstein and myself for our upcoming "March Madness" Sweepstakes program. It may be Ohio's sleeping giant of a fundraiser.


## Lent is a Time for Family Opportunities

Now then, with Lent just around the corner, I want to talk a little bit about the Good Friday Family Promotion. If your council is interested in participating in the Good Friday Family Promotion Family activity, now is the time to plan to do it. Be sure to order your resources from Supreme ahead of time. Setting an example for their community, Knights will

attend Good Friday services with their families and work with their pastors to encourage increased parishioner involvement at these liturgies. In conjunction with these efforts, councils will also work to educate their parishes about the plight of Christians in the Holy Land.



Beginning on Ash Wednesday, promote Good Friday services at Friday Fish Fries and other parish and council meetings and events throughout the Lenten season. Be sure to give plenty of reminders in the weeks leading up to Good Friday. Ask council members to take direct action and encourage their family and friends to attend. Request the contact information for elderly, sick or non-driving parishioners from your pastor and assist them in attending Good Friday services. Develop bulletin announcements explaining the central nature of Good Friday. Make pulpit announcements on the central nature of Good Friday. Post on your council and parish website/social media pages. Set the example in your parish! Organize council members and their families to celebrate the Good Friday services together.

Keep in mind that conducting the Good Friday Family Promotion does not satisfy the program requirements for the Christian Refugee Relief Program.

The two activities are separate and cannot be double counted. As always, don't forget to report this Faith In Action Family program activity on the state website when completed!

## Faith in Action Offers Many Lenten Related Faith Activities


#### Brothers in Christ.
