- WHEREAS Blessed Michael McGivney was a dedicated priest, serving as the pastor of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut; and
- WHEREAS Blessed Michael McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus with the help of several men of St. Mary's Parish in New Haven in 1882 to strengthen their faith and to provide financial assistance in the event of their death to the widows and orphans they left behind; and
- WHEREAS The cause for Blessed Michael McGivney's sainthood was opened by Hartford Archbishop Daniel A. Cronin in December 1997 and was presented to the Vatican in 2000, and is now under review by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints; and
- WHEREAS On Saturday, March 15, 2008, Pope Benedict XVI approved a decree recognizing the heroic virtue of Blessed Michael McGivney, founder of the Knights of Columbus, and with this declaration significantly advanced Blessed Michael McGivney's process toward sainthood; and
- WHEREAS Blessed Michael McGivney joined the rolls of the Blessed on October 31, 2021, in the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford, Connecticut at which time, an Apostolic Letter from Pope Francis was read which recognized Blessed Michael McGivney's humility, charity and concern for the welfare of all people; and
- WHEREAS We, the members of the Knights of Columbus, are profoundly grateful for this recognition of the holiness of our founder and the strength of the Knights of Columbus today is a testament to his timeless vision, his holiness, and his ideals.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,

That the Ohio State Officers, delegates, and guests attending this 125th Annual Ohio State Convention in Covington, Kentucky this May 18, 2024, will vigorously continue to support the cause for sainthood of Blessed Michael McGivney, and that we continue to offer prayers of support for this noble and caring priest.

- WHEREAS The Ohio Knights of Columbus honor and commend Pope Francis for leading a humble, Christ-like life of prayer, study of God's Word, and compassion for the poor that resulted in his election as the Supreme Pontiff, the Bishop of Rome, the 265th successor of Peter; and
- WHEREAS Pope Francis is the spiritual leader of 1.36 billion Catholics world-wide as well as the many non-Catholic believers who prayed for the election of a Pope who would have a servant's heart and set a humble, Christ-like example for all Christians; and

- WHEREAS Archbishop Lori was ordained to the episcopate as Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Baltimore, Maryland; and

- WHEREAS He has been active in his support of Pro-Life and Catholic doctrine, serving on the Committee on Pro-Life Activities and the Committee on Doctrine of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops; and
- WHEREAS He has also worked diligently with the Holy Father to improve the integrity of the priesthood and the Catholic Church throughout the world; and
- WHEREAS Archbishop Lori has been an advocate of Catholic education, serving as the chairman of the Sacred Heart University in Fairfield, Connecticut, and the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C.; and

- WHEREAS Fr. James Lang entered the seminary in 1967 and was ordained by Bishop James W. Malone in 1975. Fr. Lang has served as Associate Pastor or Pastor of several parishes throughout the Youngstown Diocese including Immaculate Conception Parish in Ravenna, St. Luke Parish in Boardman, St. Patrick Parish in Kent, St. Brendan Parish in Youngstown, St. James in Waynesburg, St. Michael Parish in Windham, St. George in Lisbon, St. Phillip in Dungannon, and St. John in Summitville. Fr. Lang also served as Chaplain for the Ohio National Guard and retired with the rank of Major; and
- WHEREAS Fr. Lang joined the Knights of Columbus in 1976 where he served as Council Chaplain in Rootstown, Windham, and Youngstown. Fr. Lang retired in 2015 but continues to serve the people of God and the Knights of Columbus; and
- WHEREAS Fr. Lang strives to enrich the faith of the Knights in Ohio with timely spiritual messages at meetings in connection with the "Let Us Be Worthy" general program; and

For more than 25 years, he has a demonstrated track record of service to Church and country, which serves him well in advancing the Knights' mission of Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism; and

Prior to that, he served as Vice President for Public Policy for 11 years, spearheading the Knights' interaction with the White House, Congress, and federal agencies. - WHEREAS, Mr. Kelly served as the first executive director of the Saint John Paul II National Shrine in Washington, D.C., and oversaw the renewal of the facility after its purchase by the Knights in 2011. During his tenure, the shrine became a leading pilgrimage site and a source of education and inspiration for Catholics throughout the United States and the world.

- WHEREAS, Patrick joined the Supreme Council staff in 2020 as the Assistant Supreme Secretary after serving as State Deputy in 2016-2018 and was elected to the Board of Directors on March 9, 2021, as Supreme Secretary, the first Native American to serve in this role in the Order's 140-year history where he oversees the Fraternal Mission, Marketing, and the General Office of the Supreme Secretary departments and he also serves as secretary of Knights of Columbus Charities Inc., Knights of Columbus Charities USA, Knights of Columbus Canada Charities, the John Paul II Shrine and Institute, and the Blessed Michael McGivney Pilgrimage Center; and
- WHEREAS, Patrick T. Mason (Gallup, New Mexico) is a member of the Osage Tribe, a Midwestern Native American tribe of the Great Plains where he and his wife, Rachel, are the proud parents of seven children.
