be around 270 new members for the year and 13.5% of our Circle of Honor quota. Ohio has consistently been in the top 20 among all jurisdictions and number 2 among the Division 1 states. It is still too early to put much stock into our current position among the jurisdictions, but hopefully your council has been actively talking to potential new members and getting ready for an all-out council recruiting effort sometime in the next month to help us get our **2,000 new members** this year. State Growth Director, Andrew Nuckols has sent out all of our Growth Incentives for the first quarter. Take advantage of his generosity. State E-Membership Coordinator Greg Singlar gives a breakdown of the entire process of how to use E-Membership on a YouTube video available for your viewing on our State Website (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6kZFGaGKgEw>). It is a well-done presentation and takes less than 10 minutes to view. It may help you have a better understanding of how to sign up a new member online with your phone or tablet.



Councils should be getting their Star Council requirements lined up already and have a plan to meet all the requirements over the course of this fraternal year and not doing them all at the end of the year. Remember, Ohio needs **59 Star Councils** this fraternal year to achieve Circle of Honor 2 years in a row. Is your council ready to contribute to this total? The first step to Star Council should be submitting your report of Program Personnel (Supreme Form #365). As of 8/28, 159 councils still have not yet submitted their Form 365. This was due June 30<sup>th</sup>. If you are one of these councils, please get it submitted in the next couple of weeks. Also, your council's Semi-Annual Audit (Supreme Form #1295) was due August 15. Both of these forms are part of the State General Program and their submission is a requirement in order to MAX the program. Finally, Supreme has issued the new Council Billing Statement August 1<sup>st</sup>. These statements are no longer sent via US mail. The Grand Knight or Financial Secretary must log into the Supreme website for your council. The council billing can be found under the "Reports" tab and can be downloaded. Councils must be current with their Supreme Per Capita tax in order to be eligible for the Star Council Award.

Please keep active, keep your members engaged, and help us to grow the Order here in Ohio!

Ohio Brother Knights,

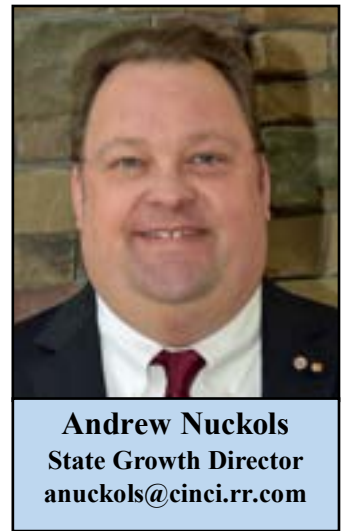

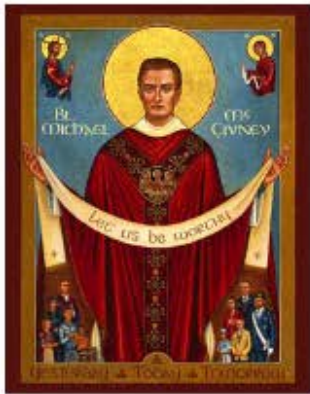

# Check to be Sure Your Paperwork is Done

Worthy Brothers,

Its hard to believe that, as we start the month of September, the first quarter will be coming to an end.

Last month I talked about the General Program and the added benefit of reporting on the State Website so that your SP-7 will be generated for you and emailed to the Grand Knight on record on May 1<sup>st</sup>.



This month let me emphasize getting the administrative tasks done. By now all councils should have submitted their Form 185 (Report of Officers) and their 365 (Program Personnel). Form 365 is also important, so those that need to be Youth Compliant get the information and get it done. Also, your semi-annual audit (Form 1295) should be submitted.

Keeping up on all the administrative requirements as they come due helps me and Brother Ken Girt from having to track you down to get them done.

District Deputies should keep checking the Star Council report that Brother Ken sends out at the beginning of the month. This valuable report tells you which of your councils have not submitted the Form 185 and Form 365 and audits etc....

Remember the 1<sup>st</sup> half incentive for councils - 2 Fraternal Benefit Events and one new member and the state council will give \$25.00 in your council's name to matching funds. These are unmatched funds.

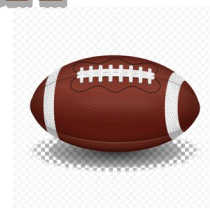
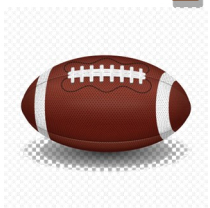

# The Incentive is: Let's Do It Again

When the last Fraternal Year ended, and Ohio made the Circle of Honor with 1,884 new members and 67 Star Councils, many of us declared, "*Let's do it again!*".

And we will. But it will take a concentrated effort from all our councils to bring new men into the Order. The councils in Ohio have responded to the *Fast Start* clarion call from Growth Director Andy Nuckols and we are at 13.16% of our quota as I write this. Not bad for the first 2 months, but it could be better.

How do we do it, you ask? We need to ask the men to join the Knights. We need to inform them of the many opportunities to help the Church and their community, of all the good they can do to serve others.

Growth Director Andy Nuckols has announced several incentive programs for councils and District Deputies designed to encourage Growth and Program Reporting. We have incentives in place to encourage councils to recruit and grow. Claim them and bring men and families into the K of C as the councils achieve Star Council.

We also have incentives for the District Deputies to succeed as well. District Deputies are responsible for several councils and are a mentor to each council's success, as he guides his district to achieve success as a Star District.

We had 67 Star Councils last Fraternal Year. I think we can do 80 this year. To meet that goal, we need to encourage more councils to meet their Growth goals. We need more councils to sponsor and do programs in the Church and Community, and we need the programs to be submitted to the Ohio State Program and to the Supreme Faith in Action Program.

Incentives are designed to produce results. Review the incentives offered by Supreme and the Ohio State Council and use them to grow your council and meet our goals this year of **2,000 new members** and **59 Star Councils**.

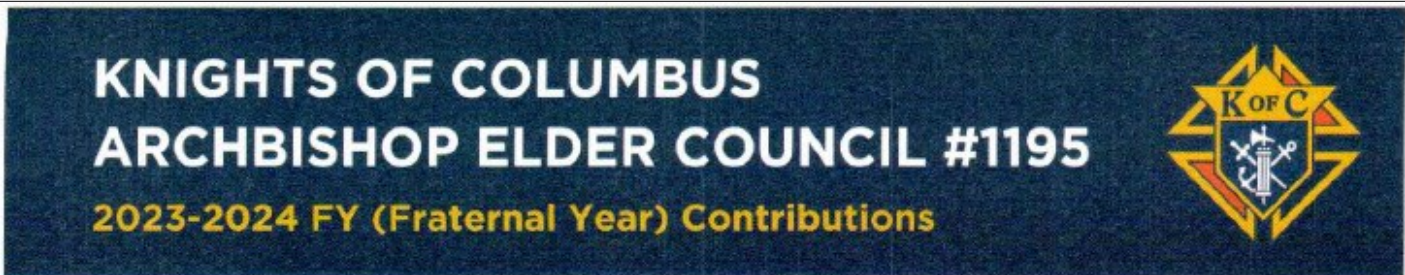
